**Descendant of 17th century
Freemason spy Fulke Greville has won
a legal battle to reclaim a sword he
claims was 'stolen' from his ancestor -
which valued at £7million would make
it the most expensive antique weapons

HM The Queen's "Curator" of the seven million pound sword", recently stolen from the custody of Merlin Entertainments at Warwick Castle. offers a reward of £1,000,000 for information leading to the recovery of the 17th century Rosicrucian Grand Master's sword once the property of Fulke Greville, 1st Lord Brooke.
